NEEDS STATEMENT

Continuing advances in science and technology place increasing and changing demands on specialists in obstetric anesthesiology. In addition, the focus on quality improvement and patient safety and health outcomes in medicine has created a need for evidence-based clinical information and data to direct quality of care and development of practice guidelines that address standards of care of patients before, during, and after surgical, obstetric, therapeutic, and diagnostic procedures. Therefore there is a critical need for leading-edge educational programs to address the acquisition and maintenance of competence in the field. The conference is designed to provide an update on current topics and issues in obstetric anesthesiology practice.

The planning committee identified the professional practice gaps that need to be addressed, based on review of participant evaluations from the 2009 conference, articles in the medical literature, and clinical practice guidelines. In addition, the planning committee identified topics of interest to practitioners in the field based on the 41st Annual Meeting of the Society for Obstetric Anesthesia and Perinatology (SOAP) held in May, 2009, in Washington, DC.

EVALUATION

Evaluation by questionnaire will address program content, presentation, and possible bias.

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

- Discuss the future of regional analgesic and anesthesia in obstetrics
- Evaluate the benefits and risks of the use of new adjuvants for labor and post-operative analgesia during cesarean delivery

- Evaluate the special needs of pregnant women requiring cardiopulmonary resuscitation

- Apply risk management techniques to increase maternal and neonatal safety and reduce the incidence of medico-legal claims associated with poor neonatal outcomes
- Promote implementation of crew resource management (CRM) concepts in obstetric anesthetic practice
- Apply approved strategies for neonatal resuscitation

NEEDS STATEMENT

Given the significant potential adverse patient outcomes, airway management is a critical skill in anesthesia. This activity is designed to provide participants with refresher course lectures and the anesthesia practitioner with state-of-the-art information as well as hands-on experience to manage the difficult airway in an appropriate manner.

The planning committee has reviewed the previous activity evaluation report, medical literature, and the American Society of Anesthesiologists (ASA) Closed Claims Project database. The ASA database is a standardized collection of case summaries derived from the closed claims files of professional liability insurance companies. The analyzed data, published in summary articles, provide a unique tool not only for reducing malpractice liability exposure for anesthesiologists, but for improving patient safety and health outcomes.
