

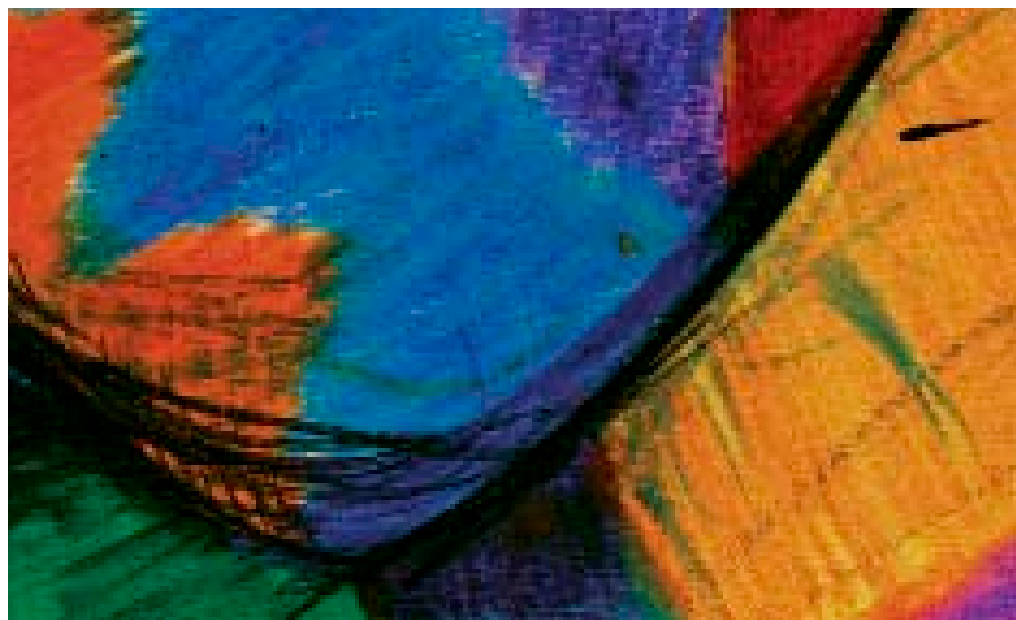

Program Description

This two-and-a-half day continuing medical education symposium has been designed to impact worldwide patient care by fulfilling the educational needs and practice gaps of the physician attendees, incorporating multiple desired physician attributes. The needs of the attendees were assessed through an extensive review process of previous course evaluations, an online needs assessment and a six month follow-up survey. The resulting scientific program represents a worldwide overview and hybrid approach to important issues facing practicing physicians who are involved with the care and treatment of patients with cardiovascular disease. Recent developments in clinical studies relating to TEVAR, EVAR, TAVI, interventional devices, and angioplasty for peripheral carotid disease will be discussed.

The symposium is designed for cardiovascular, vascular, and thoracic surgeons, cardiologists, anesthesiologists, family practice physicians, interventional radiologists, internists, residents, nurses, physicians assistants, nurse practitioners, perfusionists, and other health care professionals involved in the care and treatment of patients with cardiovascular diseases.

General Abstract Information

Submission of original abstracts are being accepted and will be considered for oral, poster, and video presentation at The Houston Aortic Symposium at the Westin Oaks Hotel, Houston, Texas on March 22, 23 and 24, 2012.

The abstract should be organized as follows:

- Type the title in capital letters. Omit abbreviations in the title, but you may use them in the text. Do not underscore the title.
- Include the name (first name then family name), institution, city and country of authors. Please underscore the name of the presenting author.
- Text of your abstract should adhere to the following guidelines:
 - Title: Make as brief as possible indicating the nature of the study
 - Concise statement of the purpose of the investigation
 - Material and methods of the study
 - Summary of the results
 - Conclusions supported by the results of the investigation
 - Do not include references
