

Rules Regarding Med-Path and Med-Rad Conferences

- 1) The maximum number of cases for Med-Path will be 4 and for Med-Rad will be 8.
- 2) All cases must have my approval before being placed on the list for each conference.
- 3) The list must be completed by 1 week before the scheduled conference.
- 4) The list will be generated by me and given to the Chief Medical Resident (CMR). No submissions directly to the CMR will be accepted.
- 5) The administrative CMR will be responsible for giving the list to the staff radiologist and pathologist a week before the conference. The CMR will also be responsible for telling the staff radiologist and pathologist what the proven or suspected diagnosis is and what we hope will be shown and discussed.
- 6) Each case must be presented by the medical resident assigned to the patient. This means that the resident involved cannot schedule his/her day off on the day of the conference. Nor can working in the clinic be an excuse for his/her absence. *NO RESIDENT, NO CASE.*
- 7) The medical resident must limit the case presentation to 30 seconds. When the case is finished being discussed by the radiologist or pathologist, the medical resident must then give a 2-minute presentation on what he/she considers good take-home points from the case. The content of this 2-minute presentation must have my approval before the conference takes place.
- 8) Only cases with proven or near proven diagnoses are eligible.
